Few people can read the entire passage and answer all the questions in a given passage in less than 18 minutes. It takes skill to read a question, understand the meaning, identify the keywords, and find that information in the passage in less than two minutes. Even if you understand the question and know where to look, it can still be a challenge to identify what information is necessary to help you answer the question. As you work through these short passages, you can respond based on the question type. Each passage will be followed by a single and predictable question. But I can't underline this enough.... Be sure to challenge yourself by setting a timer. And keep in mind that some TOEFL issues take longer than others. For example, when it comes to vocabulary questions, give yourself only 60 seconds to answer. However, if you are working on detail questions, set the timer for 90 seconds.
